*(Submitted by the 80th General
Assembly) (First Regular Session)*

Authorizes issuance of bonds not exceeding \$200,000,000 for control of water pollution by providing funds for sewage treatment facilities by counties, municipalities, and sewer districts, or any combination thereof. Since the General Assembly must authorize the amount and timing of bonds issued, the amount of general revenue required for debt service would depend on the bonds outstanding and their interest rate.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 2

*(Submitted by the 80th General
Assembly) (First Regular Session)*

Consolidates highway and transportation departments; alters distribution of road funds; provides that one-half of existing sales taxes on motor vehicles and any future increases in vehicle license fees be used for road and transportation purposes. The consolidation provision would save approximately \$50,000 annually. Based on 1979 actual collections, the increased distribution to counties would have diverted \$10.5 million from state highway funds, and transfer of one-half of motor vehicle sales tax receipts (\$36.3 million) from the general revenue fund would have resulted in distributions to the cities of \$5.4 million, to the counties \$3.6 million, and to the state highway fund \$27.3 million. The total annual transfer from state funds, based on 1979 collections, would amount to \$19.5 million.
